Have a lovely Christmas break and we wish you and your family all the best for the new year.




Bowland's Got Talent Auditions




In school, all staff and students stopped work for a 2 minute silence of reflection, and the last post rang out through the corridors.

Bowland Christmas Lunch


Mrs Cox along with our lovely kitchen team created and served our pupils their fabulous Christmas lunch. As you can see below it was very festive in the dining hall.







Year 10 and 11 have been introduced to the Free Career Quiz available through SACU.






Through simple visual questions it answers the following questions:

12 Days of Christmas Competition




The overall winners were:
