Privacy notice – how the trust uses information from third parties

What categories of information are processed?

The categories of personal information that we process include the following:

- Personal information e.g. name, contact details
- Employment information e.g. employer, relevant qualifications
- Safeguarding information e.g. safeguarding checks

This list is not exhaustive – to access the current list of information the trust processes, please see the trust's Data Asset Register, which is available from the Data Protection Officer.

Why do we collect and use your information?

We collect and use your information for the following reasons:

- To improve the management of third party data
- To enable the development of a comprehensive picture of the third parties used by the trust and how they are deployed
- To inform the development of contracts and retention policies
- To allow better internal financial modelling and planning
- To allow individuals/organisations to be paid
- To manage the services we deliver

Under the UK GDPR, the legal basis/bases we rely on for processing personal information for general purposes are:

• For the purpose of purpose in accordance with the lawful basis of lawful basis

How do we collect your information?

We collect your personal information via the following methods:

- Contracts and enquiry forms
- Application forms
- Employment forms

Data relating to third parties is essential for the trust's operational use. Whilst most of the information you provide us is mandatory, some of it is requested on a voluntary basis. To comply with the UK GDPR, we will inform you at the point of collection whether you are required to provide certain information to us or if you have a choice.

How do we store your information?

Your personal information is retained in line with the trust's Records Management Policy, which is available from the Data Protection Officer.

Who do we share your information with?

We routinely share your information with:

- The DfE
- Other schools within AtC

Why do we share your information?

We do not share information about you with anyone without your consent, unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Sharing with the DfE

We share information about third parties with the DfE for the purpose of purpose and lawful basis.

Any information we share with other parties is transferred securely and held by the other organisation in line with their data security policies.

What are your rights?

You have specific rights to the processing of your data; these are the right to:

- Request access to the information the trust holds about you.
- Restrict the trust's processing of your personal data, i.e. permitting its storage but no further processing.
- Object to direct marketing (including profiling) and processing for the purposes of scientific and/or historical research and statistics.
- Have your personal data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete.
- Not be subject to decisions based purely on automated processing where it produces a legal or similarly significant effect on you.
- Request the deletion or removal of personal data where there is no compelling reason for the continued processing.

How to withdraw consent and lodge complaints

Where our trust processes your personal data with your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
